### PROGRAM NOTES

Dmitri Shostakovich composed the FESTIVE OVER-TURE in 1954. It demonstrates one of his greatest attributes, the ability to write a long sustained melodic line combined with a pulsating rhythmic drive. In addition to the flowing melodic passages, there are staccato rhythmic sections set off against the opening and closing fanfares. It is truly a "festive" overture.

Ruffin Borden's WORK NUMBER III opens with a contrapuntal fanfare movement. The second movement, introduced by a solo horn, features the flute, horn, and accoustic guitar in a lyrical interplay. The third movement, a march, will not be performed tonight.

Vincent Persichetti's PAGEANT was composed under a commission from the American Bandmasters Association in 1953. It opens in a slow tempo with a motive in the horn that is used throughout both sections of the piece. The slow chordal introduction is succeeded by a lively "parade" section introduced by the percussion.
